What is Back Button Focus?

Back Button Focus (BBF) separates the autofocus (AF) function from the shutter button, giving you more control over focus by assigning it to a different button on the back of your camera. It's a game-changer for photographers who want sharper images and better focus control.



Now, let's break it down...

Benefits of Back Button Focus

- Prevents accidental refocusing when you recompose your shot.
- Ideal for action, portrait, and wildlife photography.
- Simplifies tracking moving subjects while keeping your focus locked.



How to Enable BBF

Canon Cameras:

Open your camera's menu.

Navigate to the Custom Controls section.

Assign the AF-ON button to focus.

Disable autofocus from the shutter button.

Nikon Cameras:

Go to Menu > Custom Settings > Autofocus. Assign the AF-ON button to back button focusing.

Sony Cameras:

Menu button > Custom Settings (gear icon) > Custom Key Settings. Choose a button (usually AEL or AF-ON) to assign AF/MF Control Hold or AF-ON. Disable focus from the shutter by setting Shutter AF to Off in the AF/MF section.

For other camera models, refer to your manual or online resources.

How to Use BBF

- 1. Aim at your subject and press the AF-ON button to focus.
- 2. Release the button once focus is locked.
- 3. Recompose if necessary, then press the shutter button to capture the image.



Toggling Your Focus Point

- 1. Set Your Camera to a Mode Allowing Focus Point Selection: Typically, this is Single Point AF.
- 2.Use the Directional Pad or Joystick: Most DSLRs and mirrorless cameras have these controls for moving the focus point.
- 3. Assign a Custom Button for Quick Toggle (if available): Refer to your manual for camera-specific instructions.

Best Uses for BBF + Focus Point Toggling

- Portraits: Lock focus on the subject's eyes. Usually the eye closest to camera.
- Sports/Action: Track subjects as they move across the frame.
- Creative Compositions: Focus on elements off-center for dynamic framing.

PRO TIP

Practice toggling your focus points while using BBF to make this technique second nature. The more you practice, the faster you'll get.
